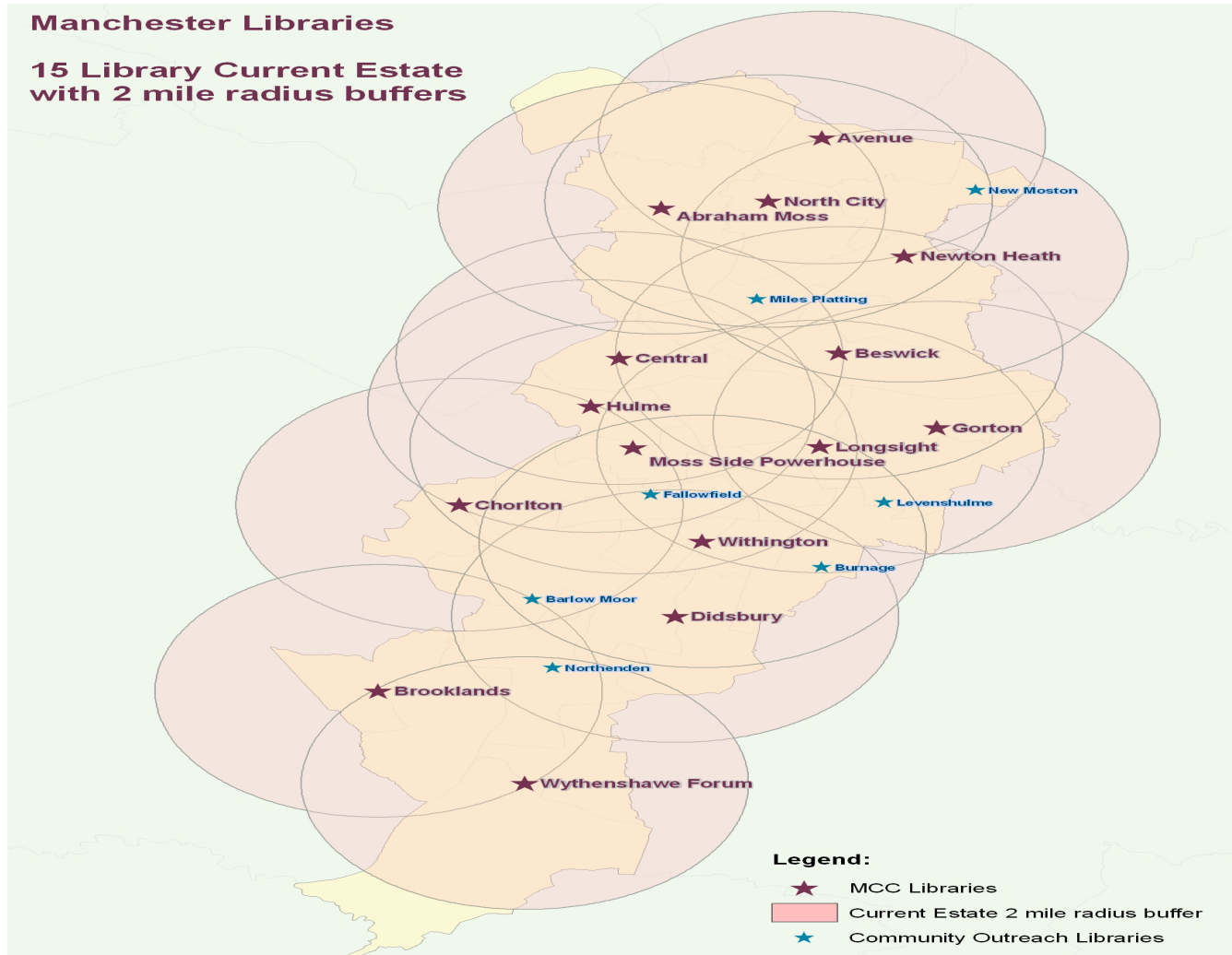

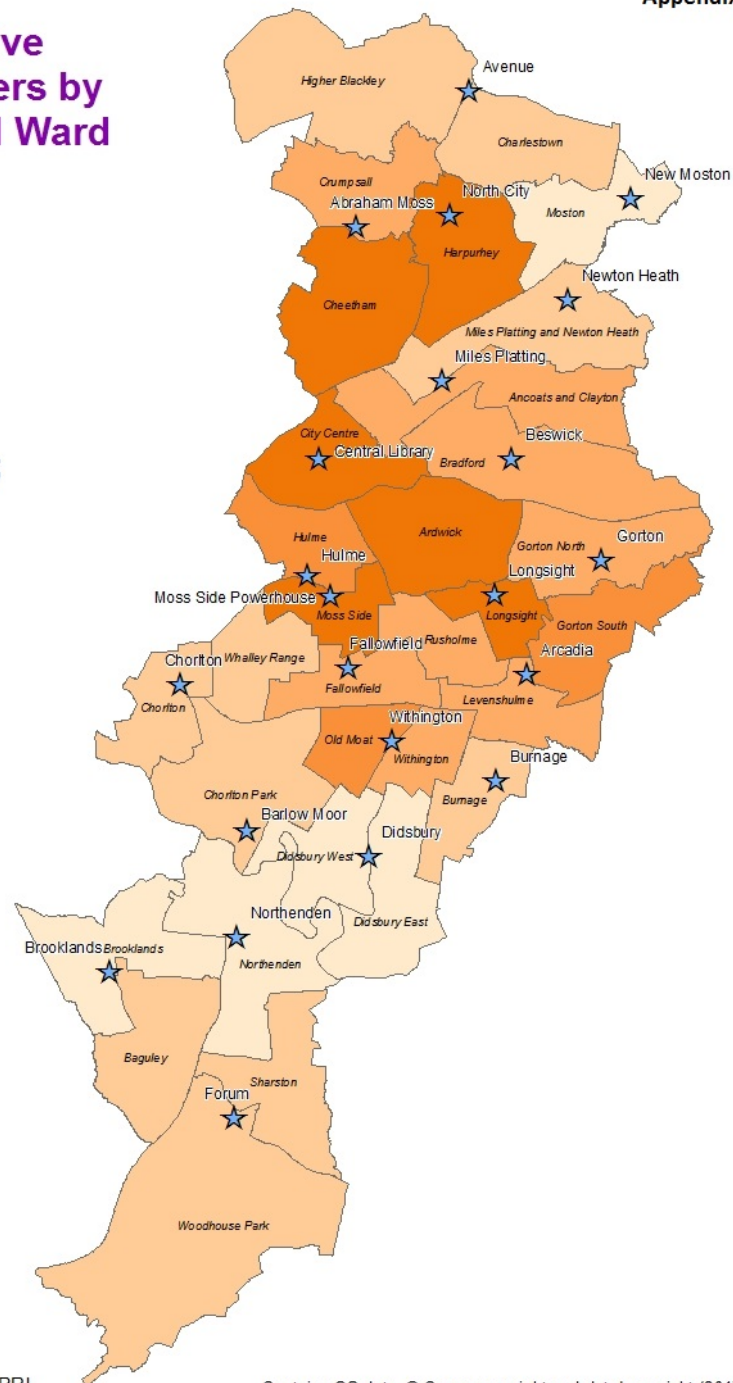
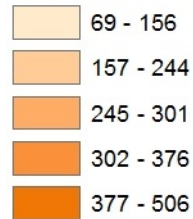

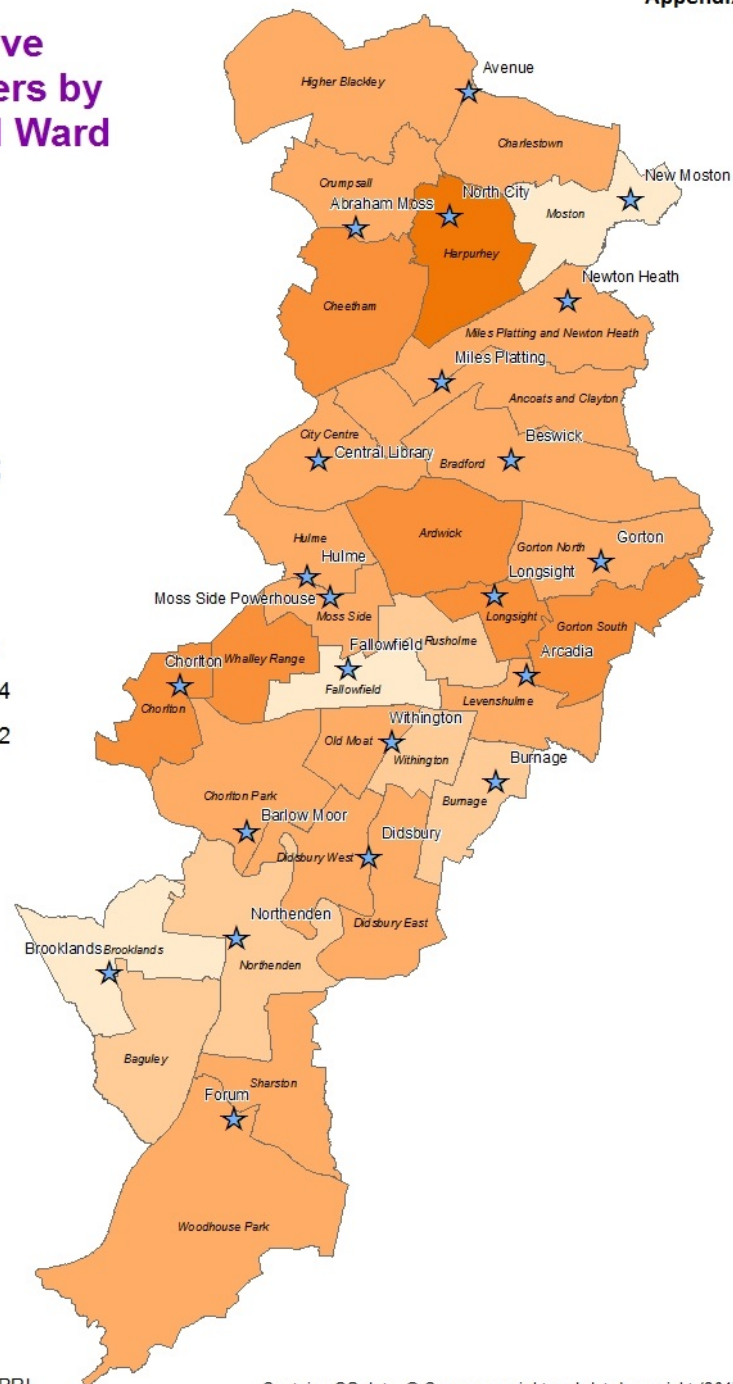
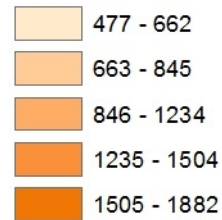

Strategic context

2008 Library Strategy – Tiered and Layered

- Review of existing locations – district centres, transport, corner plots
- Identify potential partners and funding
- No more stand alone libraries
- Design principles – glazed frontage, flexible space and retail approach
- New technology – RFID, customer self service, Wifi
- Customer offer – learning, reading, health, information, digital and cultural – for all ages
- Political and community support



Progress

- 80% of library estate refurbished, modernised or rebuilt since 2005
- Co-location with other partners and service providers
- Leisure Centres x 3
- Adult Education and Community Learning Centres x 2
- Further Education
- Commercial and Retail Partners
- Schools and Academies x 2
- Community partners – social housing providers creating cultural hubs
- Now only 5 stand alone libraries in the city

Investment

- £75m over 10 years
- Refresh FOH 6 – 7 years
- Refresh ICT 6 – 7 years
- Ongoing opportunities – 2 new Library and Leisure Centres
- Health and Wellbeing hubs

Community Libraries

- Library Express
- Smaller collection of books
- Access to FREE Internet – Resident PC hot desking
- Customer Self Service - RFID
- Buddy/Parent Library
- Volunteers / Partner Agencies
- 15 hour minimum staffed opening hours

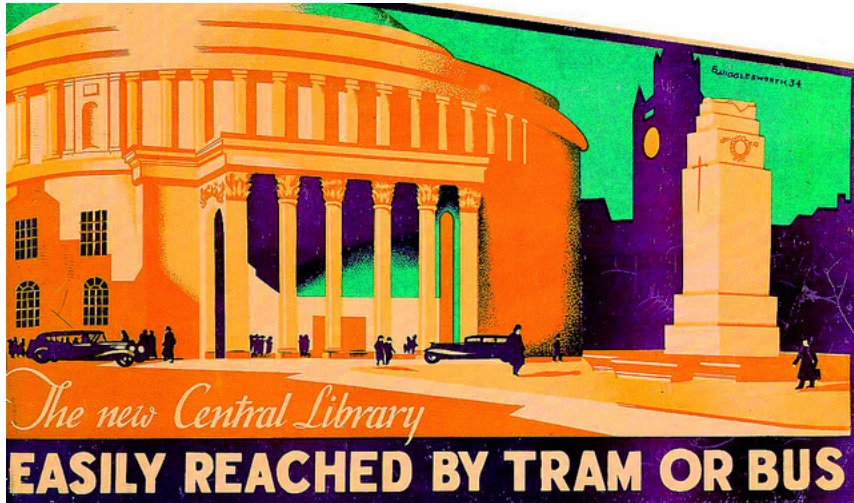
Lessons Learned

- Shared Vision and Leadership – Executive Member and Officers
- Engagement – Community and local members

- One MCC Team approach

- Refresh the strategy – continuous improvement

Central Library Transformation

- A major programme of refurbishment and transformation including the Town Hall Extension, Central Library, Library Walk and St Peter's Square.
- Major refurbishment of Central Library - iconic and much loved building and cultural venue for residents, communities & visitors



Central Library Transformation

- £50m capital programme
- City's Living Room, City's Study, City's Brain
- Reborn 22 March 2014 – 1.6 million visitors
- Connections rather than collections – 70/30
- Redefined customer offer
- New audiences – CYP, Families, BME, Tourist
- Archives +, BIPC, Music, Digital
- Collections review
- Cultural venue and destination – improved reach
- Library City
- Manchester Central Library Development Trust
- Cultural Partnerships – Manchester Art Gallery
- Ward engagement & Central Library on Tour
