- Libraries deliver wide range of outcomes
- Libraries are often unable to provide a detailed picture of the value of their work
- Evaluation within libraries and of soft outcomes generally, can be inconsistent, or of limited value



- Impact is a simple and quick evaluation framework that can evaluate soft outcomes
- Has been developed into a piece of software
- Can be used by local authorities, medium and large organisations and community groups
- Created by Norfolk Library and Information Service and shared with Norwich City Council



- Impact uses a series of evaluative statements, linked directly to outcomes, to assess value of interventions
- Evaluative statements are mapped against corporate priorities of each local authority
- Activity is also linked to international, national and local campaigns, funders, and other measures




- Impact evaluates outcomes relating to Skills, Learning, Information, Leisure, Wellbeing, & Health
- Also evaluates outcomes relating to people's sense of community, the environment, equality and diversity, and places people live
- Further development will create highly specified outcomes that can be linked to beneficiary groups












Future development and scope
